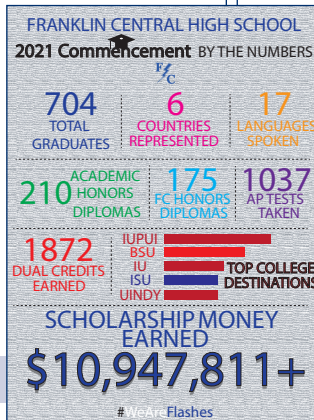


Growing to Meet the Future
